

Arboretum Newsletter late spring / early summer 2022



It's that magical time of year when we see a profusion of spring blooming flowers, many of them native ephemerals, at The Arboretum. While the winter aconite (*Eranthis hyemalis*) (I know, not a native, but one of my favorites) and blood root (*Sanguinaria candensis*) have already "done their thing," other plants are in bud and will soon be blooming or revealing themselves at The Arboretum.

One location that surely merits a springtime visit is the native ephemerals bed in the Walk Across Kentucky Native Plants Collection. A collage of photographs (taken by previous Native Plants Collection Manager, Emily Ellingson) is shown above to entice you to visit and experience the annual show of ephemerals native to the Shawnee Hills Region of Kentucky.

Pictured are (upper left) wild blue phlox (*Phlox divaricata*); (lower left) trillium (*Trillium sp.*) and waterleaf (*Hydrophyllum sp.*); (center) Virginia bluebells (*Mertensia virginica*); (upper right) Celandine poppy (*Stylophorum diphyllum*); and (lower right) sensitive fern (*Onoclea sensibilis*) in front of purple rocket (*Iodanthus pinnatifidus*). Good news for visitors--these photos were taken over a two-month period, so while you won't see all of them in bloom at the same time on one visit, any visit to the Shawnee Hills emphemerals bed should provide something interesting to see this spring.

As you will see below, there is a lot going at The Arboretum in April, May, and June. While this newsletter provides an overview of the educational programming, we strongly encourage you to consult the calendar tab of our website to see full details.

On the Grounds

The Native Plants team spent several weeks in February and March working on wintercreeper management in The Arboretum Woods. Wintercreeper (*Euonymous fortunei*) is a non-native invasive species that has proliferated in the Woods since efforts to remove the non-native bush honeysuckle were successful. Because wintercreeper is evergreen, winter is an ideal time to complete targeted management of this species when most native native species are dormant. Our team has been managing the species with a combination of efforts that include cutting vines from trees, spraying the foliage with a broadleaf selective herbicide, and hand pulling small areas of the plant. We have been fortunate to have had assistance from Dr. Ellen Crocker's Forestry 399 Invasive Species Management class for these efforts, in addition to our dedicated native plants volunteer crew!

Do you have unwanted items that we need?

Dawn Bailey is collecting items for two projects in the Kentucky Children's Garden (KCG) and we would appreciate any items you don't need!

Project 1

Dawn is collecting wood (pressure-treated lumber and western cedar) to construct two flower boxes in the KCG. If you have lumber left from a project, we would love to have it. Here's what we need:

- Western cedar 1-inch by 4-inch fence planks (12-inch minimum lengths)
- **Pressure-treated** 2-inch by 8-inch boards (3-foot minimum lengths)
- **Pressure-treated** 2-inch by 10-inch boards (3-foot minimum lengths)
- **Pressure-treated** 4'inch by 4-inch posts (10-inch minimum lengths)

Project 2

Dawn is collecting used and clean coffee pods. These small plastic cups are difficult to recycle and often end up in the landfill. Help give them new life by donating them to us! We will use them for crafts and planting seeds.




Become a 2022 Season Member!



Protecting and Connecting Urban Tree Collections in a Changing Climate

Arboretum staff are collaborating with the Urban Forest Initiative (UFI) and others at UK to better understand the current and future effects of climate change, and how we can adapt our collection management policies to meet future needs. Claire Hilbrecht, UFI Lead Technician, is working on a multi-faceted project involving The Arboretum, the UK Campus and the community of Lexington. Read on to find out what is being offered and how you can participate.

Part 1: Protecting and Connecting Urban Tree Collections in a Changing Climate webinar

Claire has collected data from native trees in our Walk Across Kentucky Collection and our Horticultural Collection, in addition to trees on the UK Campus and in neighborhoods across Lexington, to develop baseline information. She will present **Protecting and Connecting Urban Tree Collections in a Changing Climate** on Wednesday May 11, 2022 at 12:30 p.m. via a Zoom webinar. The presentation will discuss how Kentucky plants are responding to climate change. Participants will learn how native trees will be affected by climate change and how community members can care for their local tree canopies amidst these changes. Participants will also learn about the work that is being done in Lexington and at The Arboretum to help prepare our tree canopies for a changing climate.

Part 2: Tree Inventory Workshop

This in-person workshop at The Arboretum will teach volunteers to identify common tree species, as well as how to measure and assess tree size and health. No prior tree ID experience is necessary, just a love of nature and a concern for the wellbeing of our shared tree canopy. Participants should bring a notebook and pencil, as well as a tape measure and charged smartphone if they have access to these items, though no materials are required.

Part 3: Community Science Tree Inventories at 12 Lexington Parks

Saturday May 14, 2022, 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. (in-person)

Now, put everything you have learned in the webinar and in the workshop to use! Volunteers are needed to inventory trees in 12 public parks in Lexington as a part of a community science initiative to help prepare our local tree canopies for climate change.

One park from each Lexington-Fayette Urban County Government (LFUCG) Council District has been selected to be inventoried and mapped. Many Lexington parks have significant tree collections that benefit the health and well-being of a broad audience. The LFUCG Parks and

Recreation Master Plan consistently highlights walking and hiking trails, natural areas, and small neighborhood parks as areas that are important to and well used by community members. Connecting these tree collections to climate adaptation management strategies will help protect these public outdoor resources in a changing climate so that they can continue to be used and enjoyed by a wide audience across Lexington. Results from tree inventories will be shared with LFUCG staff to help inform adaptation practices such as tree plantings and land management for a resilient landscape.
